Punishment means imposing external control by force on children to change their wrong behaviour and to make understand what is right and what is wrong. When the child is punished the misbehaviour often stops immediately. The parents feel in control and that he/she hasn't let the child "get away with it".

STEPS IN POSITIVE DISCIPLINE

- Ignore minor, irritating behaviour.
- Praise and reward positive behaviour.
- Be specific with praise.
- Work with the child to set basic rules.
- Decide together what consequences will result from breaking the rules.
- Use consequences consistently and calmly when rules are broken.

- Discipline is a way of life, where one tries to be on time and live in a systematic way.
- Discipline is not limited to money, riches or by poverty but is just a personal orientation towards life.
- It is a habit and not an adaptation in life.
- Discipline in life has many virtues like being focused, staying healthy and also avoiding problems.
- Discipline is one of the factor by which people judge others.

Dr. A.P.J. Abdul Kalam
President of India

Dr. Avul Pakir Jainulabdeen Abdul Kalam, the 11th President of India from 2002 to 2007, rightfully termed as the father of India's missile technology. He was born to parents Jainulabdeen Marakayar and Ashiamma on 15th October, 1931, at Dhanushkodi in Rameshwaram district, Tamil Nadu, Dr. Kalam as an eminent Aeronautical Engineer, contributed for the development of India, s first satellite launch vehicle SLV-3 and the missile like the Trishul, Agni, Privi etc.

He did his secondary education at Schwartz High School in Ramanathapuram B.Sc. at st.Joseph's college (1950), Tiruchi, and DMIT in Aeronautical Engineering at the MIT, Madras during 1954-1957. After passing out as a graduate aeronautical engineer, Kalam joined Hindustan Aeronautics Limited (HAL) Bangalore later joined as a technical assistant in the directorate of Technical Development and production of the ministry of Defence.

In the 1960 Kalam joined the Vikram Sarabhai space centre at Thumba in Kerala. In 1982 he rejoined DRDO as a Director, and conceived the Integrated guided Missile Development Programme (IGMDP) for five indigenous missiles. Dr. Kalam joined Annamalai University till he became the president in January 2002. Dr. A.P.J. Abdul Kalam has been awarded by Padma Bhushan in 1981, Padma Vibhushan in 1990 and India's Highest civilian Award 'The Bharat Ratna' in 1997. He writes poetry in Tamil, his mother Tongue. Dr. Abdul Kalam's vision is to transform India into a developed nation by the year 2020 through hard work and preserverance.

In some states, like Haryana & Rajasthan, there are many women whose babies are aborted in their womb before a girl could come up in the world.

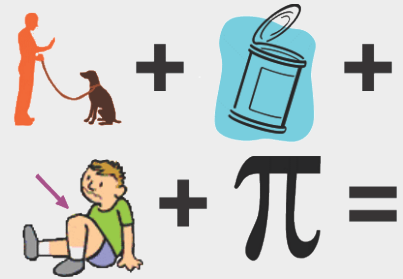

Causes of Child Labour :

To have or increase the income of a poor family

To reduce the labour cost in a production organization

In a developed society where every citizen counts and all citizens have to have proper education, so that when he is fully grown adult he can get a full employment with standard salary.

Solutions to Child Labour :

The solutions to the problem of Child Labour are:

The Child labour laws need to be strictly enforced by the Government.

The general public need to be made aware of the severe consequences of Child labour.

An increase in employment opportunity for adults would help in overcoming the problem of poverty and child labour.

Government should ensure that every child gets the opportunity to go to school. The owners of factories and mines should take the pledge of not engaging child in their place of business.

If a boy or a girl takes up a small job as a domestic help or restaurant boy against a nominal salary of Rs. 750-1800 per month, she does not get enough time for primary and secondary education and is most likely to remain completely illiterate, unskilled, perhaps with a weak health and will have to remain unemployed forever.
