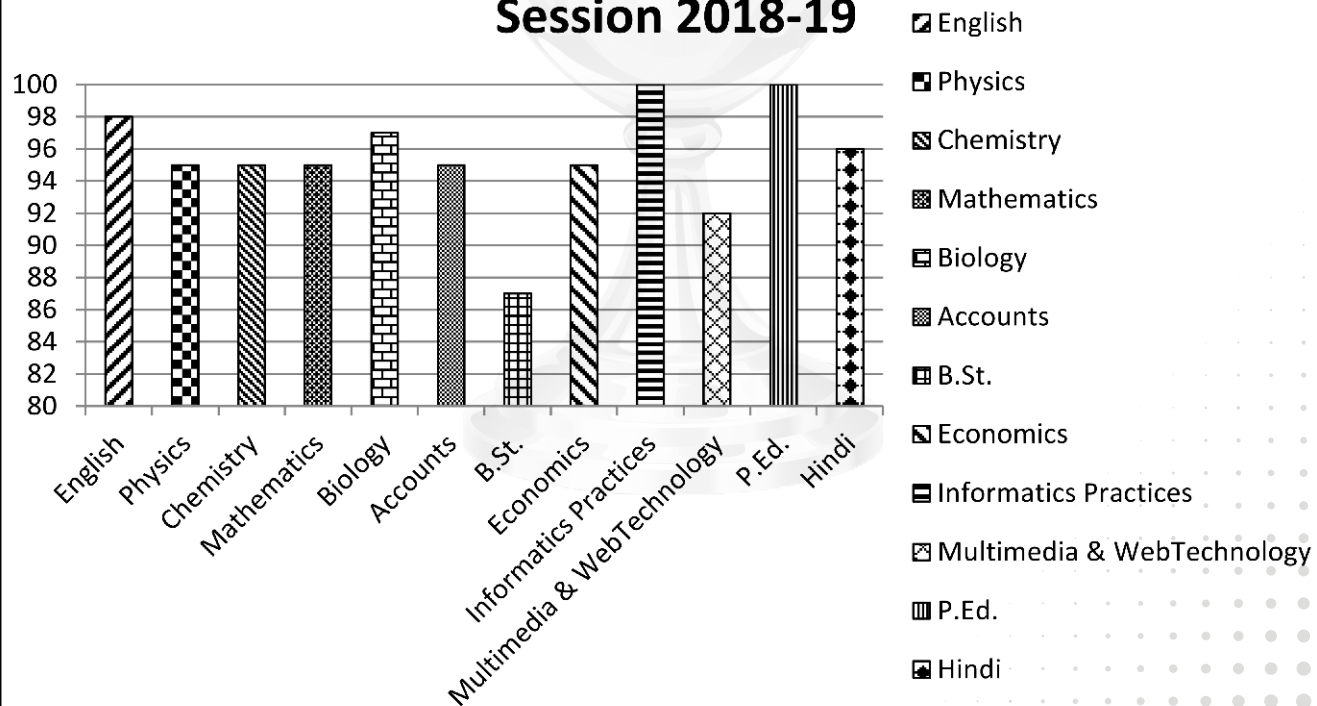
## Class-XII Subject Wise Highest Marks Session 2017-18

## Janmashtami Celebration

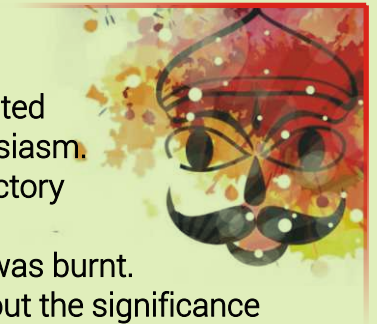

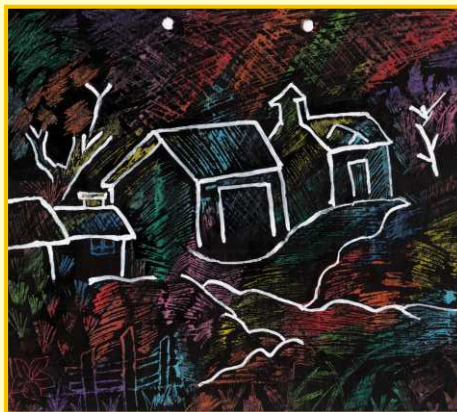

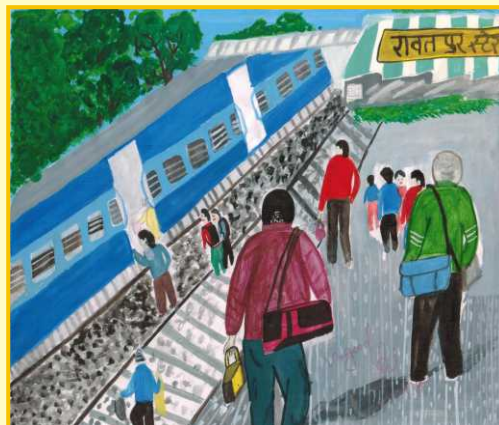

## **DIGITAL DIVIDE**

Digital divide is a term that refers to the gap between demographics and regions that have access to modern information and communications technology, and those that don't or have restricted access. This technology can include the telephone, television, personal computers and the Internet.

Community Informatics (CI) provides a somewhat different approach to addressing the digital divide by focusing on issues of "use" rather than simply "access". CI is concerned with ensuring the opportunity not only for ICT access at the community level but also, according to Michael Gurstein, that the means for the "effective use" of ICTs for community betterment and empowerment are available. Gurstein has also extended the discussion of the digital divide to include issues around access to and the use of "open data" and coined the term "digital divide" to refer to this issue area.

The digital divide also impacts children's ability to learn and grow in low-income school districts. Without Internet access, students are unable to cultivate necessary tech skills in order to understand today's dynamic economy. Federal Communication Commission's Broadband Task Force created a report showing that about 70% of teachers give students homework that demand access to broadband. Even more, approximately 65% of young scholars use the Internet at home to complete assignments as well as connect with teachers and other students via discussion boards and shared files. A recent study indicates that practically 50% of students say that they are unable to finish their homework due to an inability to either connect to the Internet, or in some cases, find a computer. This has led to a new revelation: 42% of students say that they received a lower grade because of this disadvantage. Finally, according to research conducted by the Center for American Progress, "If the United States were able to close the educational achievement gaps between native-born white children and black and Hispanic children, the U.S. economy would be 5.8 percent—or nearly \$2.3 trillion—larger in 2050".

They can facilitate change in different types of behaviour. Behavioural change techniques do work, but you must know when and how you apply them. Skill, timing and repetition are all important. Some behavioural techniques are stated.



**1. Self-Monitoring** - You need to know what your actual level of physical activity is before you can appreciate what needs to be changed. Usually these triggers can be identified and strategies can be established to help and deal with them. Track your behaviour with activity to identify these triggers and patterns.

**2. Goal Setting** - While most of us familiar with the concept of setting goals but many of us don't realise that successful goal setting depends on choosing the right goals. A goal should also be fairly specific and reasonably challenging. The goal should also clearly specify which behaviour reflects progress.

**3. Corrective Feedback** - For corrective feedback, you should understand the following aspects of helpful feedback. Helpful feedback must contain useful information. Feedback that focuses on success gives participants a sense of control.

**4. Boosting Performance** - Positive reinforcement can help in changing behaviour, but changing will not be lasting. Reinforcement should be used to recognise desirable behaviour that get someone to be active.

## » HYGIENE-BEING CLEAN «

Personal hygiene is a concept that is commonly used in medical and public health practices. It is also widely practised at the individual level and at home. It involves maintaining the cleanliness of our body and clothes. The practice of personal hygiene is employed to prevent or minimize the incidence and spread of communicable diseases.



### Components of Personal Hygiene -

- **Body Hygiene (Skin Care)** - The body has nearly two million sweat glands. This is especially observed in the groin, underarms and feet, and in clothing that has absorbed sweat. Taking a bath or a shower using body soap daily is very important to ensure that our body stays clean.
- **Oral Hygiene (Oral Care)** - The mouth is the area of the body most prone to collecting harmful bacteria and generating infections. Our mouth cavity is full of bacteria and is a good environment for bacterial growth. The proper steps for mouth cleansing are -
  - \* Rinse the mouth after each meal.
  - \* Brush your teeth with a fluoride-containing toothpaste twice a day – before breakfast and before you go to bed.
  - \* During the day, fill your mouth with water and swish it around to get rid of anything stuck to your teeth.



- **Handwashing (Hand Care)** - The cleanliness of our hands is very important in all our daily activities. In our normal activities our hands frequently gets dirty.  
Proper hand washing steps:-
  - \* First, wet your hands with clean water and lather with a bar of soap.
  - \* Next, rub your hands together vigorously and scrub all surfaces up to your wrists.
  - \* Clean under your fingernails.
  - \* Rinse your hands well with clean running water (pour from a jug or tap).
- **Clothes Hygiene** - We usually have two layers of clothing. These are right next to our skin and collect sweat and dead skin cells, which can stain the cloth. Bacteria loves to grow on this dirt and produces a bad smell in addition to the specific odour of the sweat.

- **Do Talk:** Perhaps not immediately, but tell that person how you're feeling and try to sort the matter out without anger.



### Don'ts :-

- **Don't Deny That You're Angry :** Talking about your feelings is great. Please note, we said talking.
- **Don't Stomp Or Storm:** Banging doors, running off or causing a scene isn't going to help matters. Do something that makes you feel calm before moving on.
- **Don't Send an E-mail Or Text:** Next time you're angry, stay away from all technology – this is the worst time to tell someone what's on your mind.
- Don't smash things, punch walls, beat, scream etc.
- Don't drink alcohol to “wash away” problems.
- Don't blame or injure yourself.

एक बार की बात है। रूस के ऑस्पेंस्की नाम के महान विचारक एक बार संत गुरजियफ से मिलने उनके घर गए। दोनों में विभिन्न विषयों पर चर्चा होने लगी। ऑस्पेंस्की ने संत गुरजियफ से कहा, 'यूँ तो मैंने गहन अध्ययन और अनुभव के द्वारा काफी ज्ञान अर्जित किया है, किंतु मैं कुछ और भी जानना चाहता हूँ। आप मेरी कुछ मदद कर सकते हैं?' गुरजियफ को मालूम था ऑस्पेंस्की अपने विषय के प्रकांड विद्वान हैं, जिसका उन्हें थोड़ा घमंड भी है। अतः सीधी बात करने से कोई काम नहीं बनेगा। इसलिए उन्होंने कुछ देर सोचने के बाद एक कोरा कागज उठाया और उसे ऑस्पेंस्की की ओर बढ़ाते हुए बोले - "यह अच्छी बात है कि तुम कुछ सीखना चाहते हो। लेकिन मैं कैसे समझूँ कि तुमने अब तक क्या-क्या सीख लिया है और क्या-क्या नहीं सीखा है। अतः तुम ऐसा करो कि जो कुछ भी जानते हो और नहीं जानते हो, उन दोनों के बारे में इस कागज पर लिख दो। जो तुम पहले से ही जानते हो उसके बारे में चर्चा करना व्यर्थ है और जो तुम नहीं जानते, उस पर चर्चा करना ठीक रहेगा।" बात एकदम सरल थी, लेकिन ऑस्पेंस्की के लिए कुछ मुश्किल। उनका ज्ञानी होने का अभिमान धूल-धूसरित हो गया। ऑस्पेंस्की आत्मा और परमात्मा जैसे विषय के बारे में तो बहुत जानते थे, लेकिन तत्व-स्वरूप और भेद-अभेद के बारे में उन्होंने सोचा तक नहीं था। गुरजियफ की बात सुनकर वे सोच में पड़ गए। काफी देर सोचने के बाद भी जब उन्हें कुछ समझ में नहीं आया जो उन्होंने वह कोरा कागज ज्यों का त्यों गुरजियफ को थमा दिया और बोले-श्रीमान मैं तो कुछ भी नहीं जानता। आज आपने मेरी आँखें खोल दीं। ऑस्पेंस्की के विनम्रतापूर्वक कहे गए इन भावों से गुरजियफ बेहद प्रभावित हुए और बोले-ठीक है, अब तुमने जानने योग्य पहली बात जान ली है कि तुम कुछ नहीं जानते। यही ज्ञान की प्रथम सीढ़ी है। अर्थात् खाली बर्तन को भरा जा सकता है, किंतु अहंकार से भरे बर्तन में बूँद भर ज्ञान भरना संभव नहीं। अगर हम खुद के ज्ञान को ग्रहण करने के लिए तैयार रखें जो ज्ञानार्जन के लिये सुपात्र बन सकेंगे। ज्ञानी बनने के लिए जरूरी है कि मनुष्य ज्ञान को पा लेने का संकल्प ले और वह केवल एक गुरु से ही स्वयं को न बाँधे, बल्कि उसे जहाँ कहीं भी अच्छी बात पता चले, उसे ग्रहण करें।"

## » ग्लोबल वार्मिंग «

औसत से 20 डिग्री सेल्सियस ज्यादा गर्म हुआ, उत्तरी ध्रुव, गंभीर खतरे की घंटी।

उत्तरी ध्रुव के तापमान में औसत से 20 डिग्री सेल्सियस अधिक की वृद्धि दर्ज की गई है। इसके साथ ही इस साल अक्टूबर में यहाँ समुद्र में जमी बर्फ अपने तब तक के सबसे कम स्तर पर रिकार्ड की गई। जलवायु परिवर्तन की बहसों के बीच इन आँकड़ों ने पूरी दुनिया के लिये गंभीर चेतावनी की घंटी बजा दी है।

उत्तरी ध्रुव पर अभी ध्रुवीय रात्रि का समय चल रहा है। ऐसे वक्त में यहाँ राते 24 घंटे से भी अधिक लंबी होती है। इस समय उत्तरी ध्रुव को सामान्य तौर पर बेहद ठंडा होना चाहिए। गर्मी का मौसम बीतने के बाद अक्टूबर के महीने से यहाँ समुद्र में बर्फ के जमने की प्रक्रिया शुरू हो गई है। ऐसा होने ही वजह यहाँ 1981 से 2010 के बीच रेकार्ड किए गए समुद्रीय बर्फ की मौजूदगी के औसत की तुलना में 28-5 फीसदी बर्फ कम है। यहाँ बर्फ की मात्रा रेकार्ड करने का कार्य सबसे पहले 1979 में शुरू किया गया था। तब से लेकर अब तक के आँकड़ों पर नजर डाले, इस बार समुद्रीय बर्फ की मात्रा सबसे कम है।



नेशनल ओशनिक एंड एटमॉस्फेरिक एडमिनिस्ट्रेशन (NOAA) ने इस साल के अक्टूबर महीने को तीसरा सबसे गर्म अक्टूबर बताया है। इस सूची में 2014 पहले और 2015 दूसरे स्थान पर है। ग्लोबल वार्मिंग और जलवायु परिवर्तन को समझाने के लिए आर्कटिक काफी अहम है। यहाँ होने वाले परिवर्तन दुनिया को ग्लोबल वार्मिंग की गम्भीरता का संकेत देते हैं। असल में आर्कटिक में होने वाला बदलाव दुनिया भर के लिए खतरे की घंटी और संकट का गम्भीरता का मापदंड तय करता है।

NOAA के मौसम वैज्ञानिकों ने बताया कि आर्कटिक असाधारण तौर पर काफी लंबे समय तक गर्म रह रहा है। अक्टूबर में ग्रीनलैंड के कुछ हिस्से सहित ग्रीनलैंड में मौजूद बर्फ की परत को औसत से 7 डिग्री सेल्सियस अधिक गर्म पाया गया। अलास्का में NOAA के जलवायु विज्ञान व सर्विसेज के मैनेजर रिक यॉमन ने बताया कि अलास्का की उत्तरी ढलान पर अक्टूबर महीने में तापमान में तेजी से वृद्धि दर्ज ही गई।

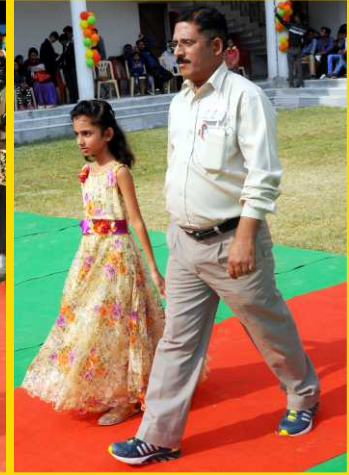


## माता पिता को सुझाव
